

- English (4 credits): to include English1- 4
- Mathematics (4 credits): to include Algebra 1, Geometry, & Algebra 2
- Science (4 credits): to include Biology and IPC, Chemistry, or Physics
 - Chemistry or Physics required for Multi-Disciplinary Endorsement
- Social Studies (4 credits): to include World Geography, World History, U.S. History, Government and Economics

EMS ISD Distinguished Level of Achievement (continued)



- World Language (2 credits): both must be from the same language
 - IEP and 504 Committee may consider substitutes
- Physical education (1 credit)
- Fine art (1 credit)
- Elective courses (6 credits)
- 1 or more endorsements

Credits, Attendance & Promotion



You earn 1/2 credit for each semester course you successfully complete



Students must be in attendance 90% of the time or credit is denied (even if you pass the class)



Promotion is based on credits earned and not years on campus

Grade level is based on credits AND years in school. Example: Having 12 credits only makes you a junior if it is also your 3rd year in school.

5 ½ to promote to 10th
12 to promote to 11th
19 to promote to 12th

- Alternates
 - You may end up in one of your alternates if your 1st choice class is canceled or becomes too full please have <u>three alternate class choices</u> ready
