








- Elementary school site in Copper Creek

- Planned opening in August 2020




Eagle Mountain High School is the final high school in current build-out scenario, considering land currently available

Natatorium / YMCA Facility

The natatorium project is a joint venture between Eagle Mountain-Saginaw ISD and the YMCA-Northwest campus. As part of the 2017 Bond Program, the district committed property off of Marine Creek (next to the new Marine Creek Middle School), along with \$5 million to fund the project.



- Dedicated swim team practice times throughout the school year, as well as times for swimming meets.
- Dedicated locker room spaces for our students and coaching offices.
- EMS ISD has naming rights to the natatorium
- Dedicated team entrance to the swim facility.

Project negotiations and specific details are still being determined; therefore, the final time for construction and opening of the new YMCA/natatorium project has not been established.
