

Planning for Growth



EAGLE MOUNTAIN-SAGINAW BOND2017 INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

- 68% of voters in favor of the proposition
- Tax rate remains at \$1.54, the same since 2012-2013



- **Prepare for Growth:** Adding fourth high school (completed 2024), purchasing land, partnership with the City of Saginaw for a multi-use natatorium (underway)
- **Upgrade Safety and Security:** Upgrade security system by adding new cameras, creating controlled vestibules with access control, adding fences, sidewalks and updating playgrounds (completed)
- Aging and Inadequate Systems and Facilities: Replacing Wayside Middle School (planning underway), centralize admin offices (completion 2022), renovated ag barn (completed), updating athletics facilities (underway), roofing, flooring, sound systems, lights (underway)
- Standardization and Equity: Update campuses to ensure equity among schools and programs while bringing systems to district's standard (underway)
- Contingency Funds: Allows for unforeseen conditions, circumstances, or expenses

- Campus spans 96,000 square feet
- 2 stories, including fine arts room, library, gym, collaborative areas, cafetorium



Eagle Mountain High School - Opening August 2024

- Colors: Black and Gold

Natatorium Facility

The natatorium project is a joint venture between Eagle Mountain-Saginaw ISD and the City of Saginaw. As part of the 2017 Bond Program, the district committed \$5 million to fund the project. This indoor swimming facility will serve EMS ISD high schools and the community of Saginaw residents. This site is conveniently located between all 3 high schools and the future fourth high school campus.




